## PhD Session at ISRS-ISG National Symposium 2022

The overall aim of the PhD Session is to bring together the PhD students doing research in the areas/topics related to Geospatial Technologies including Remote Sensing. During this session, you will get to meet other PhD students, recently finished young PhD researchers, and experienced scholars. It will host about 7-9 PhD student presentations and faculty members from various Universities/Institutes across India. It is hoped that this network of students and faculty that the workshop provides will serve you well during the main conference and hopefully in the years to come. Also, through this session, we wish to establish a good and comfortable environment, where research students will feel welcomed, free to present their works and receive feedback on your research, in addition to exchanging information concerning your overall PhD experience. It is hoped that this session will also energise the PhD student community in India to reflect on their research perspectives, their own aspirations and future implications of the research being carried out, in addition to getting a glimpse of the large landscape of the current and evolving Geospatial technologies.

## How to Participate:

- 1. We welcome all PhD students working in the area within the wider field of Geospatial technologies. Students who are encouraged to apply for presentations are those with two years or more of doctoral study or those who have progressed far enough in their research to have a structured proposal idea and some preliminary findings, but have not reached the stage of defending their dissertations. We expect them to benefit the most from this interaction.
- 2. Requirements
  - a. A Research extended abstract of not more than 1000 words (2pages) that describes your research
  - b. a short CV
  - c. a statement on how you thing this will benefit you
  - d. proof of enrollment in a PhD Program

The extended abstract be in the format of ISPRS Guidelines for Authors preparing an abstract. See [1] for details. It should be single-authored and not exceed 2 pages. The CV and personal statement also should not exceed two pages. There is no formal format for b and c.

The four documents must be merged into one PDF file in the order a, b, c, d, and send to spatial@iiit.ac.in

Your submission will be reviewed by a team of Faculty for acceptance. On acceptance, you will receive further instructions for preparing the presentation. This is a special session as part of the ISRS\_ISG Symposium and the accepted papers will not be published in the conference proceedings.
